**Description**

A bronze sculpture titled Call of the Wild depicts a stag with its head thrown back, standing on the pinnacle of a mountain. It is on an oval polished wood base with a plaque lettered "CALL OF THE WILD BY MANSEL OCHEL TREE" on

the front. It is etched "2/30 Mansel Ocheltree" with the image of a cactus in a box on a portion of the rock on the front.

**Historical Note**

The sculpture was presented in the Oval Office on April 14, 1982, along with Sen. Paul Laxalt (R-NV). During the Reagan administration it was on display in the White House West Wing Roosevelt Room and was on permanent display at the Reagan Library until 2010.
