**Historical Note**

Piter Meeter, ( Leeuwarden, baptized February 28, 1734 - there, August 1798 ), was a silver medal. He became master in 1757 and came to the Leeuwarden guild in 1766. Works from him depends on the Fries Museum. He was the son of Eylart Jans, grandmother and Johanna Westenburg. He married Hendrikje Bakkum in 1757. He died in August 1798 and was buried on August 28, 1798 from the Lord Yvostraatje in Leeuwarden. [1] The Fries Museum (Frisian Museum) is a museum in Leeuwarden, Netherlands.
