Round brass belt buckle with raised relief after Remington's sculpture, "Coming Through the Rye," which has four cowboys on horseback with raised pistols. Along the top edge is "COMING THROUGH THE RYE" in raised letters. Along the bottom edge is "October 1902," which is the date of the original sculpture. On the back is a fastener with a loop, lettered "SOLID BRASS" on the fastener.
