Historical Note

David Eugene "Elvis" McCafferty (1938-2012) developed his own breed of horses, McCafferty's American White Draft Horses, beginning in 1973. They were supposedly descendants of Silver, the famous white horse from the Lone Ranger show. The all-white draft horses weigh between 1500-1900 pounds. These horses were also seen parading in the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, the Pegus at the Kentucky Derby, and the Rose Bowl Parade.

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
