Evelyn Poolheco Description: (1916-1989) A potter from Tewa village actively fashioning pottery between 1960 and 1980, Evelyn Poolheco also signed her work Pootheco or Poothico according to Gregory Schaaf's book on Hopi-Tewa Pottery. She was Spider clan. An example of Poolheco's pottery is included in the permanent collection of the Museum of Northern Arizona. Her forms and decoration were strictly traditional employing black on yellow, black on red or polychrome motifs. Evelyn Poolheco was born on July 10, 1916 and died on May 14, 1989 at the age of 72. Evelyn last resided in Winslow, Navajo County, Arizona
